Headteacher News


As this is the first newsletter of 2025 I'd like to take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy New Year!

Did you know..... Researchers in the United States who had looked at the impact of parents reading with their children quoted the following figures about their findings: Here's how many words kids would have heard by the time they were 5 years old: Never read to, 4,662 words; 1–2 times per week, 63,570 words; 3–5 times per week, 169,520 words; daily, 296,660 words; and five books a day, 1,483,300 words. The effect on a child's academic progress, wellbeing and good life chances is huge! We will continue to visit Coxheath Library. Please do use this wonderful place to access books for free!

Uniform


