New calculation policy

Hunton CEP School follows the White Rose scheme of learning in mathematics. We have found this to be highly successful for our children, providing them with a mastery approach in mathematics.

One of the elements of mastery teaching is the use of the Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract approach (developed by American Psychologist Jerome Bruner). Put simply, the concrete element involves children using manipulatives and resources (e.g. base 10, numicon, counters, place value grids) to develop a real understanding of a concept, followed by a pictorial representation of these. The abstract element involves formal, written strategies (for example the column method for addition).

Evidence shows that introducing children to early to formal methods will hinder their understanding. So you can support at home, please read through our new calculation policy https://hunton.kent.sch.uk/curriculum/mathematics/ which outlines which resources, representations and methods your child will be doing in each year group in regards to: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Cauliflower Cards – design your own cards, wrapping paper, labels, mugs and notebooks.

Please remember to bring your child's order form back to school before Monday 30th September, you'll also need to place your order online.

Your child can draw any design (it doesn't have to be for Christmas), maybe they can make some thank you cards or

birthday cards to give out throughout the year. Additional order forms are available.

Grotto – we will be setting up the grotto again at the Christmas fayre. Cost is £4 per child, this needs to be paid in advance and will be available on School Money soon.




