In P.S.H.E/RSE this term, Borton's topic is 'Safety and the Changing Body'. Please see what Year 6 will be learning about in term 3:

- I know the steps to take before sending a message online (using the THINK mnemonic).
- I know some of the possible risks online.
- I can discuss some of the emotional changes through puberty.
- I can identify reliable sources of help with puberty.
- I know that puberty happens at different ages for people.
- I can review the process of the menstrual cycle.
- I recap the names of the external sexual parts of the body and the internal reproductive organs.
- I know and understand how a baby is conceived and develops during pregnancy.

The learning outcomes in red will be broadly taught separately to Year 5 and will form part of the children's Relationships and Sex Education (RSE). As a school, we feel strongly about teaching all content provided by the scheme we follow for this subject: 'Kapow'.

However, for the final bullet point only '*I know and understand how a baby is conceived and develops during pregnancy*', parents do have a right to withdraw their child from these lessons. If this is the case, please fill in the form below and hand into the office.
