After-school clubs

Our after-school clubs are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. We appreciate that each time the clubs are offered there will be parents who are disappointed that their child was unable to get into the club of their choice as they didn't see the email until later, but we have found in the past that no matter what time or what day of the week we send out the after-school clubs email, there are always parents who are disappointed as they didn't see the email in time. Years ago there used to be a club sign-up sheet on the table in the playground for parents to sign their child up to any after-school clubs. But again, we had parents who missed out on this as they didn't do the drop off / pick up that particular day. Hence why we changed to online booking.

We rely on the goodwill of the staff and parent volunteers, along with help from external companies to be able to offer these clubs and we do have to set the maximum number of children per club based on adult:child ratios and so that the club can run smoothly without being over-crowded.
