

This week our Year 1 children have completed their Phonics Screening and Year 4 have done their Multiplication Check – results for both will be shared when we have them. We are super-proud of the children for their determination and focus.

I have been struck by how all our visitors to Hunton in this last term (how has that come around so fast?) have remarked on the contagious energy and vibrancy around the school. #### **Attendance**

We are getting more and more requests for leave of absence during term time due to families having booked holidays. Please can we gently remind you that, unless the circumstances are genuinely exceptional, these cannot be authorised.

Currently if a child's attendance is below 90% we send a letter, which can be followed by more formal processes if attendance does not improve. If your child's attendance is below 90% they will have missed at least 20 days over the year: this is like missing a whole month of school. On the annual reports we will be adding how many days of school your child has missed, as well as their % attendance. Please help us keep our attendance at a minimum of 97%. Thank you for your support with this.



#### Borton's trip to the British Library

On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June, Borton went on a trip to London to visit the British Library where they toured round to look at King George III's book collection, the conservation of books and the treasure of books exhibition. Also, the class attended a 'Sacred Texts' workshop, where the children got to examine real, old and sacred books from a range of religions, analysing why they think the book was sacred to people of different cultures. A member of the public on the London Underground praised the class's behaviour as, "impeccable" and the workshop facilitator commented that the class were "the best group she ever had" for their deep-thinking answers and their respectful nature. # If your child will be starting in Year 6 in September, these are the dates for the Kent Test

Key dates	
Thursday 1 June 2023	Registration opens at kent.gov.uk/kenttest. You will receive a confirmation email when registration is complete.
Monday 3 July 2023	Registration closes at midnight.
Thursday 7 September 2023	Children who attend a Kent primary school sit the test in their school.
Saturday 11 September 2023	Children who attend primary schools outside Kent, or are Educated at Home sit the test in a Test Centre.
Wednesday 18 October 2023	Kent Test Decisions emails are sent after 4pm to the email address used to register the child.
